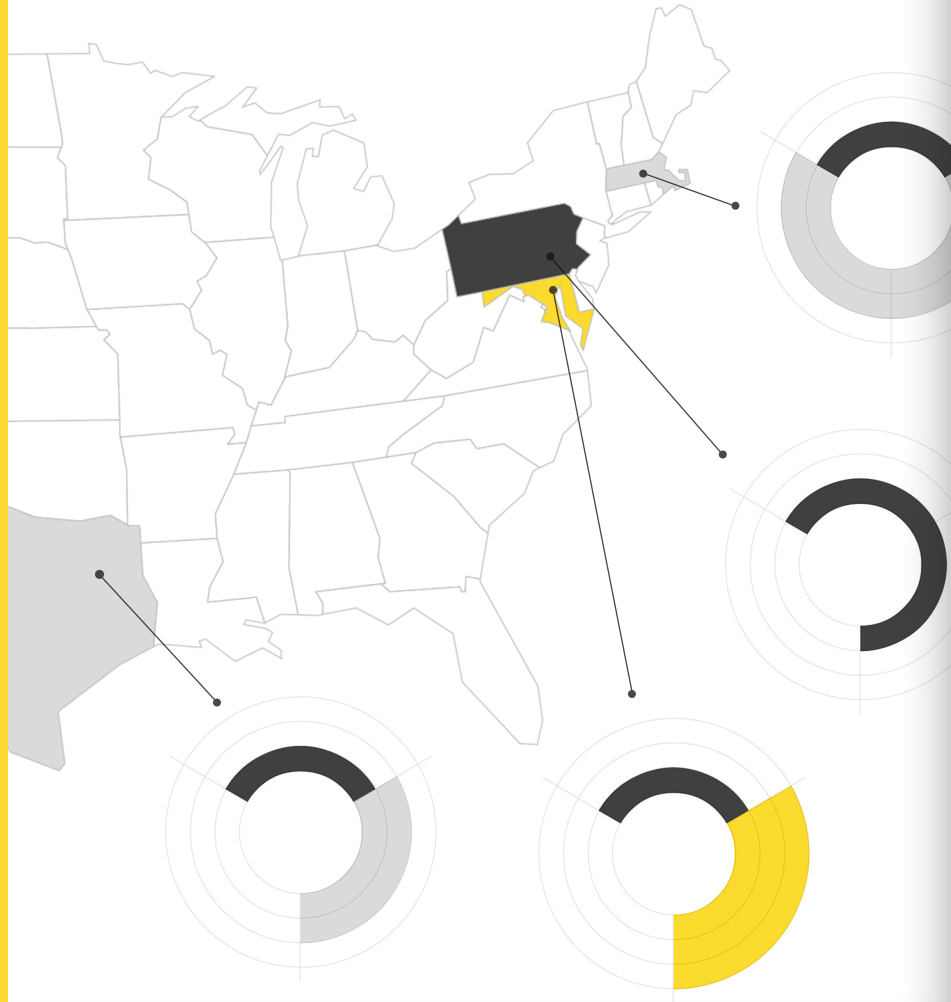

ParityTrack is a collaborative project that works to aggregate & elevate the parity implementation work taking place across the country.

ParityTrack aims to be the central site for mental health and substance use disorder parity information for multiple audiences. ParityTrack examines the current state of parity implementation across the country through the Parity Reports, which analyze legislation, regulatory actions, and litigation at the federal and state levels.

The Parity Reports are one of the key components of the site and provide information to consumers about their rights under both the Federal Parity Law and state parity laws. The Parity Reports help empower consumers to exercise these rights by connecting them with state-based organizations that can provide assistance in the event of a parity violation.

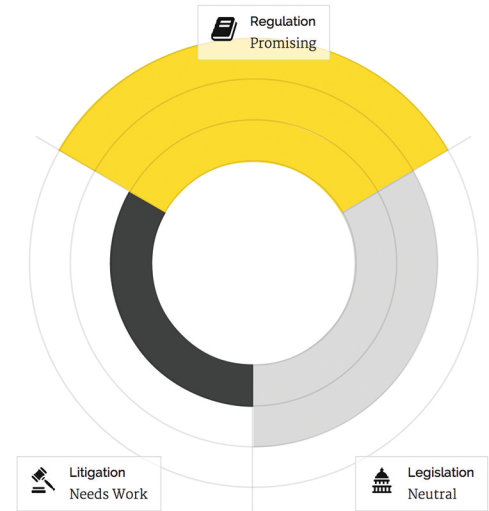
By maintaining up-to-date information on parity implementation, ParityTrack is also able to identify critical issues that will lead to improved access and equity and inform resources developed in conjunction with partnering organizations that help various stakeholders address these issues.

Currently, Parity Reports have been developed for five states: California, Maryland, Massachusetts, Pennsylvania, and Texas. The other 45 Reports are scheduled to be completed by September, 2015.
